Sonja Sax is an environmental health scientist that specializes in evaluating exposure and health risk from environmental pollutants. She has over 20 years of experience in environmental regulatory assessment, health impact assessment and cost-benefit analyses. Dr. Sax has managed large multi-year projects advocating for clients involved in litigation or providing permitting support. She has performed indoor and outdoor air quality investigations evaluating exposures and health impacts of airborne gases and particles. In 2019, she served as an advisor to the US EPA Clean Air Scientific Advisory Committee for the particulate matter and ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standards.

Glenn Keith is the Director of the Division of Air and Climate Programs in the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection's Bureau of Air and Waste. Glenn manages a wide range of air quality and climate mitigation programs including air quality regulation and policy development, implementation of stationary, area, and mobile source programs, the statewide ambient air monitoring network, federal air quality grants, and reporting programs. His previous work in the Bureau included managing the Toxics Use Reduction Act program and overseeing solid waste planning. Glenn joined MassDEP in 1989 and spent his first 10 years in the Bureau of Waste Site Cleanup working on policy and program development.
